27 28 29 30	(a) In fiscal year years 2023 2022 and 2023, the State Department of Education shall administer child care stabilization grants to provide financial support to child care providers that have faced a financial hardship or suffered an operational burden during the COVID-19 pandemic.

1 2 3	(b) In awarding grants under this section, the State Department of Education shall give preference to child care providers based on the following criteria, in order of priority:
4 5	(1) providers that have a demonstrated financial hardship that poses significant risk of the provider's business closing within the next 12 months;
6 7	(2) providers that have not received a stabilization grant in a prior application cycle;
8	(3) providers that participate in the Child Care Scholarship Program;
9 10	(4) providers located in areas designated by the State Department of Education as lacking child care slots;
11 12	(5) providers that serve primarily low–income populations in areas of high poverty;
13	(6) providers that serve children with special needs; and
14	(7) providers that serve children 2 years old and under.
15 16 17 18 19	(c) The State Department of Education shall award \$50,000,000 in grants to child care providers in accordance with this section and in the amount of \$50,000,000 for the remainder of fiscal year 2022 and in the amount provided for this purpose in the fiscal year 2023 operating budget, as enacted by Chapter of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2022 (S. B. 290).
20 21	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July $1,2022.$
22	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
23	measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
24	been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to

each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is

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enacted.
