## A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

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# Education – Student Horizon Database and Scorecard (Students Right to Know Act of 2022)

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education, in collaboration with  $\mathbf{5}$ certain agencies, to annually collect certain information on the military and jobs, 6 high schools, private career schools, and certain institutions of higher education in 7 the State and to create and maintain a certain Student Horizon database on the 8 Department's website that contains the information collected; requiring the 9 Department to publish, and each local school system to distribute, the Student 10 Horizon Scorecard on or before certain dates each year; authorizing certain 11 institutions and schools to enter into certain agreements to utilize data from existing 12reports and databases; and generally relating to the Student Horizon database and 13 Scorecard.

5 (C) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2023, AND EACH OCTOBER 1 THEREAFTER, 6 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PUBLISH ON THE DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE A STUDENT 7 HORIZON SCORECARD THAT INCLUDES A LIST OF:

8 (1) THE 50 HIGHEST ENROLLED MAJORS AMONG ALL PUBLIC SENIOR 9 HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS IN THE STATE;

10 (2) THE 20 CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION AND CERTIFICATE 11 PROGRAMS WITH THE HIGHEST STARTING SALARY AFTER GRADUATION OR 12 COMPLETION;

13(3)THE 25 MOST IN-DEMAND JOBS IN THE STATE AND THEIR14CORRESPONDING STARTING SALARIES AND EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS; AND

15 (4) THE BASE PAY, BENEFITS, AND AVERAGE SIGNING BONUS OF 16 STUDENTS WHO ENLIST IN THE MILITARY AFTER HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION, 17 ALONG WITH THE NECESSARY ARMED SERVICES VOCATIONAL APTITUDE BATTERY 18 SCORE BY MILITARY BRANCH.

19 (D) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 31, 2023, AND EACH OCTOBER 31 20 THEREAFTER, EACH LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM SHALL DISTRIBUTE TO EACH HIGH 21 SCHOOL STUDENT THE MOST RECENT STUDENT HORIZON SCORECARD PUBLISHED 22 ON THE DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE.

23 (E) IN ORDER TO SATISFY THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION, AN 24 INSTITUTION OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION OR A PRIVATE CAREER SCHOOL MAY 25 ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS TO INCORPORATE DATA FROM EXISTING DATABASES AND 26 REPORTS, INCLUDING:

27 (1) THE NATIONAL ACCREDITING COMMISSION OF CAREER ARTS 28 AND SCIENCES ANNUAL REPORTS;

29 (2) THE INTEGRATED POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION DATA SYSTEM 30 OF THE NATIONAL CENTER FOR EDUCATION STATISTICS;

31 (3) THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION COLLEGE 32 SCORECARD; AND

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1 (4) THE MARYLAND HIGHER EDUCATION COMMISSION DATA BOOKS 2 AND ANNUAL REPORTS.

3 (F) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS 4 SECTION.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2022.
