## Education – Public and Nonpublic Schools – Seizure Action Plans (Brynleigh's Act)

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a county board of education and authorizing a nonpublic  $\mathbf{5}$ school, beginning in a certain school year, to require a <del>certain number of school</del> 6 personnel at the school to be trained school nurse or an individual designated by the 7 school nurse to receive professional development training in certain seizure 8 recognition and response methods; requiring a public school a certain individual, 9 beginning in a certain school year, to provide training with a certain frequency to 10 school personnel with direct contact and supervision of students on certain seizure 11 recognition and response methods; requiring the State Department of Education and 12the Maryland Department of Health, in consultation with a certain entity and 13 stakeholders, to develop guidelines and a training program for school personnel on 14the health care needs of a student diagnosed with a seizure disorder; requiring the 15parent or guardian of a student diagnosed with a seizure disorder to collaborate with 16 school personnel to create a seizure action plan and provide the school with certain 17information; requiring the State Department of Education, in collaboration with the Maryland Department of Health, to ensure health guidelines include certain 18 19information on seizures; and generally relating to responding to seizure symptoms 20and emergencies in schools in the State.

1 (2) SCHOOL PERSONNEL MUST BE APPROVED BY THE SCHOOL NURSE 2 BEFORE THE PERSONNEL ARE AUTHORIZED TO ADMINISTER OR ASSIST WITH 3 SELF-ADMINISTRATION OF A SEIZURE RESCUE MEDICATION.

4 (3) A SCHOOL NURSE MAY SERVE AS ONE OF THE TRAINED SCHOOL 5 PERSONNEL REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

6 (E) (F) (1) THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF A STUDENT DIAGNOSED 7 WITH A SEIZURE DISORDER SHALL COLLABORATE WITH SCHOOL PERSONNEL TO 8 CREATE A SEIZURE ACTION PLAN.

9 (2) THE DEPARTMENT, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE MARYLAND 10 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, SHALL ENSURE:

11 (I) HEALTH GUIDELINES INCLUDE SEIZURE FIRST AID 12 PROCEDURES; AND

13 (II) HEALTH PLANS INCLUDE SEIZURE ACTION PLANS.

14 (3) A COPY OF A SEIZURE ACTION PLAN SHALL BE:

15 (I) RETAINED IN THE OFFICE OF THE SCHOOL NURSE OR AN 16 ADMINISTRATOR; AND

17 (II) DISTRIBUTED TO ANY SCHOOL PERSONNEL OR VOLUNTEER
18 RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SUPERVISION OR CARE OF A STUDENT DIAGNOSED WITH A
19 SEIZURE DISORDER.

20 (F) (G) (1) THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF A STUDENT DIAGNOSED 21 WITH A SEIZURE DISORDER SHALL PROVIDE THE SCHOOL WITH:

(I) A WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION FOR A TRAINED SCHOOL
EMPLOYEE TO ADMINISTER OR ASSIST WITH ADMINISTERING SEIZURE MEDICATION
AT SCHOOL;

25(II)THE PRESCRIBED MEDICATION IN AN UNOPENED, SEALED26PACKAGE WITH THE LABEL AFFIXED BY THE DISPENSING PHARMACY INTACT; AND

27 (III) A WRITTEN STATEMENT FROM THE STUDENT'S HEALTH 28 CARE PRACTITIONER THAT INCLUDES:

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 19 201, 2022.
