## A BILL ENTITLED

4 5 6 7	FOR the purpose of establishing a program, to be administered by the Maryland Transportation Authority, for State residents to resolve unpaid video tolls and related civil penalties; and generally relating to unpaid video tolls and related civil penalties.		
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10 11	(a) (1) There is a program to incentivize and enable State residents to resolve unpaid video tolls and related civil penalties.		
12	(2) The Maryland Transportation Authority shall administer the program.		
13 14	(b) The purpose of the program is to reduce the number of residents with delinquent unpaid video tolls and related civil penalties.		
15	(c) A person is eligible to participate in the program if the person:		
16	(1) is a State resident;		
17	(2) has unpaid video tolls and related civil penalties; and		
18	(3) has not been issued a judgment by the Central Collection Unit.		
19 20	(d) (1) The Authority shall notify a resident who may be eligible to participate in the program at the resident's last known address.

2 3	information for th	(i) the website address where the resident may find contact e Authority;	
4 5	tolls and related c	(ii) the total delinquent amount the resident owes in unpaid video ivil penalties; and	
6		(iii) the amount of penalties that may be waived under the program.	
7	(e) The A	Authority shall:	
8 9	(1) waive 70% of a resident's delinquent unpaid video tolls and related civil penalties that became delinquent before July 1, 2022; and		
10	(2)	require a resident to:	
11		(i) obtain and maintain an E–ZPass until June 30, 2024; and	
12 13	subtracting the wa	(ii) pay the remaining balance of the delinquent account owed, after aived amount and any Central Collection Unit fee.	
14 15 16 17	(f) The Authority may allow a resident to enroll in a monthly installment plan to pay, within 6 months after the Authority waived 70% of the resident's unpaid video tolls and related civil penalties, the remaining balance of the delinquent account after subtracting the waived amount and any Central Collection Unit fee.

20 21 22 23	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2022. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2024 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
