4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Housing and Community Development, the Department of Planning, the Department of Human Services, and the $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Department of Agriculture to jointly produce a report for each county and each State 7 legislative district on the food environment in the county and district on or before a 8 certain date and at a certain frequency thereafter, and submit the report to the 9 General Assembly; and generally relating to food environments in State legislative 10 districts establishing the Workgroup on Food Environments to determine and make recommendations regarding the most cost-effective method for producing a report 11 on the food environment in each county and State legislative district; and generally 12relating to the Workgroup on Food Environments. 13

4 (2) "SNAP" MEANS THE FEDERAL SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION 5 ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

6 (3) "WIC" MEANS THE FEDERAL SPECIAL SUPPLEMENTAL FOOD 7 PROGRAM FOR WOMEN, INFANTS, AND CHILDREN.
