$5 \\ 6$	(a) A person may not knowingly or fraudulently obtain or attempt to obtain a license to drive or a moped operator's permit by misrepresentation.
7 8	(b) A person may not in any application for a license to drive or a moped operator's permit:
9	(1) Use a false or fictitious name;
10	(2) Knowingly make a false statement;
11	(3) Knowingly conceal a material fact;
12	(4) Use a false, fictitious, or fraudulently altered document; or
13	(5) Otherwise commit a fraud.
