34 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

1 (a) On or before December 31, 2022, the Department of the Environment shall 2 report to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government 3 Article, on:

4 (1) the location and results of any testing for PFAS chemicals, as defined 5 in § 6–1601 of the Environment Article, that the Department has conducted on waters of 6 the State;

7 (2) any plan the Department has for further testing for PFAS chemicals in 8 waters of the State; and

9 (3) any plan the Department has for remediation and public education in 10 areas where the water has been found to be contaminated by PFAS chemicals.

11 (b) On or before December 31, 2023, the Department of the Environment and the 12 Maryland Department of Health jointly shall prepare, in coordination with other relevant 13 State agencies, the federal government, local governments, and the public, and submit to 14 the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, a 15 PFAS Action Plan to identify strategies, actions, and funding alternatives to:

16 (1) minimize environmental exposure to PFAS chemicals for Maryland 17 residents, in addition to regulating its use in fire–fighting foam, food packaging and food 18 packaging components, rugs, and carpets;

(2) minimize future releases of PFAS chemicals into the environment;

20 (3) identify, assess, and clean up historical releases of PFAS chemicals in 21 Maryland;

(4) assess any concerns related to environmental justice, health equity, and
 PFAS chemical contamination; and

24 (5) educate and communicate to Maryland residents the risks associated 25 with PFAS chemicals.

26 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 27 1, 2022.
