General Assembly - Residency Requirement - Enforcement - Factors

- 3 FOR the purpose of specifying factors to be considered when the State Board of Elections 4 or a court determines whether a candidate for or a member of the General Assembly 5 meets the residency requirements of the Maryland Constitution; specifying that a 6 member who is an active duty member of the military may not be considered to have 7 established or abandoned a residence under certain circumstances; requiring the 8 General Assembly Counsel to annually review the compliance of each Senator and 9 Delegate with the residency requirements; clarifying that this Act does not impose any additional requirements on a Senator or Delegate; and generally relating to the 10 11 residency of candidates for and members of the General Assembly.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "MEMBER" MEANS A CANDIDATE FOR OR A MEMBER 22 OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
- (B) A candidate for public or party office must be a registered voter at an address that satisfies any residence requirement for the office that is imposed by law and, in the



- 1 case of a party office, by party rules.
- 2 (C) IN DETERMINING WHETHER A MEMBER IS A RESIDENT OF A DISTRICT AS
- 3 REQUIRED BY ARTICLE III, SECTION 9 OF THE MARYLAND CONSTITUTION, THE
- 4 STATE BOARD OR ANY COURT SHALL CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING FACTORS:
- 5 (1) THE ADDRESS LISTED ON THE MEMBER'S DRIVER'S LICENSE OR
- 6 OTHER STATE-ISSUED IDENTIFICATION CARD;
- 7 (2) THE STREET ADDRESS WHERE THE MEMBER RECEIVES MAIL,
- 8 UNLESS THE ADDRESS IS A POST OFFICE BOX;
- 9 (3) WHETHER THE BUILDING CLAIMED AS THE MEMBER'S RESIDENCE
- 10 IS ZONED FOR RESIDENTIAL USE AND COMPLIES WITH ANY APPLICABLE BUILDING
- 11 CODES:
- 12 (4) WHETHER THE MEMBER HAS TRANSFERRED TITLE TO A PREVIOUS
- 13 ADDRESS;
- 14 (5) WHETHER THE MEMBER OWNS, RENTS, OR LEASES RESIDENTIAL
- 15 PROPERTY CLAIMED AS THE MEMBER'S RESIDENCE;
- 16 (6) WHETHER THERE IS PROOF THAT THE MEMBER HAS PAID FOR AND
- 17 USED UTILITIES AT THE ADDRESS CLAIMED BY THE MEMBER AS THE MEMBER'S
- 18 **RESIDENCE**;
- 19 (7) WHETHER THE MEMBER RECEIVES MAIL AT THE ADDRESS
- 20 CLAIMED AS THE MEMBER'S RESIDENCE;
- 21 (8) WHETHER THE SCHOOL REGISTRATION OF ANY MINOR CHILDREN
- 22 OF THE MEMBER LISTS THE ADDRESS CLAIMED AS THE MEMBER'S RESIDENCE;
- 23 (9) WHETHER THE MEMBER'S SPOUSE OR ANY OTHER IMMEDIATE
- 24 FAMILY MEMBERS RESIDE AT THE ADDRESS CLAIMED AS THE MEMBER'S
- 25 RESIDENCE;
- 26 (10) WHETHER THE ADDRESS CLAIMED AS THE MEMBER'S RESIDENCE
- 27 IS ALSO LISTED AS THE MEMBER'S RESIDENCE IN OTHER EMPLOYMENT RECORDS;
- 28 (11) WHETHER THE ADDRESS CLAIMED AS THE MEMBER'S RESIDENCE
- 29 IS ALSO LISTED ON ANY MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION OR TITLE HELD BY THE
- 30 **MEMBER**;

- 1 (12) WHETHER THE ADDRESS CLAIMED AS THE MEMBER'S RESIDENCE
- 2 MATCHES THE ADDRESS LISTED ON THE MEMBER'S MARYLAND AND FEDERAL
- 3 INCOME TAX RETURNS; AND
- 4 (13) WHETHER THE MEMBER IS AN ACTIVE DUTY MEMBER OF THE 5 MILITARY.
- 6 (D) A MEMBER WHO IS AN ACTIVE DUTY MEMBER OF THE MILITARY MAY NOT
 7 BE CONSIDERED TO HAVE ESTABLISHED OR ABANDONED A RESIDENCE SOLELY
 8 BASED ON WHERE THAT MEMBER IS STATIONED.
- 9 (E) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY COUNSEL SHALL ANNUALLY REVIEW THE 10 COMPLIANCE OF EACH SENATOR AND DELEGATE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF ARTICLE III, SECTION 9 OF THE MARYLAND CONSTITUTION.
- 12 (F) THIS SECTION DOES NOT IMPOSE ANY ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS ON 13 A MEMBER BEYOND THOSE IMPOSED BY ARTICLE III, SECTION 9 OF THE MARYLAND 14 CONSTITUTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2022.
