CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

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State and Local Procurement - Payment Practices

3 FOR the purpose of requiring each county and municipality to adopt a certain policy; altering a State policy regarding the payment of certain funds after receipt of a 4 proper invoice; reducing the number of days following receipt of an invoice after 5 6 which the State owes interest on unpaid amounts and interest begins to accrue on 7 certain unpaid procurement contract amounts; repealing a requirement that a 8 contractor submit an invoice within a certain amount of time in order to receive 9 interest payments; requiring the Department of Legislative Services to submit a 10 certain report to the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to the payment practices of the State and local governments for amounts 11 owed under procurement contracts. 12

3 4	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

7 8 9 10	NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW, EACH COUNTY AND MUNICIPALITY SHALL ADOPT THE POLICY ESTABLISHED UNDER § 15–103 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE WITH REGARD TO PAYMENT FOR GOODS AND SERVICES PROCURED BY THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY.

13 14	It is the policy of the State to make a payment under a procurement contract within [30] 15-days:

8 9 10	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 1, 2022, the Department of Legislative Services shall report to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, on:
11	(1) for each unit of State government:
12 13	(i) the number of unit staff whose work responsibilities involve processing procurement contract payments;
14 15	(ii) the number of vacancies for positions that would be assigned to process procurement contract payment; and
16	(iii) for at least the prior 3 fiscal years:
17 18	1. the average time for the unit to process a procurement contract payment;
19 20	<u>2.</u> <u>the percentage of procurement contract payments that are:</u>
21 22	A. paid within 30 days after the day on which the payment becomes due under the procurement contract;
23 24	B. paid after 30 days but less than 37 days after the day on which the payment becomes due under the procurement contract;
25 26	C. paid after 37 days but less than 45 days after the day on which the payment becomes due under the procurement contract; and
27 28	D. paid 45 days or more after the day on which the payment becomes due under the procurement contract; and
29 30	3. the amount of interest paid by the unit for late payments made on procurement contract invoices;

3 4	(i) reducing the number of days following receipt of an invoice after which the State owes interest on unpaid amounts; and
5 6	(ii) reducing the number of days following receipt of an invoice after which interest begins to accrue on unpaid amounts; and
7 8	(3) the status of the upgrade of the Comptroller's online payment processing portal.
9 10	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2022.
11 12	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 1 of this Act shall take effect June 1, 2023.
13 14	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
