- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article Education
- 15 SUBTITLE 11. OUTDOOR PRESCHOOL LICENSE PILOT PROGRAM.
- 16 **9.5–1101.**
- 17 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 18 INDICATED.
- 19(B) "OUTDOOR, NATURE-BASED EARLY LEARNING AND CHILD CARE20PROGRAM" MEANS AN EARLY LEARNING OR CHILD CARE PROGRAM:
- 21 (1) THAT IS PRIMARILY OPERATED OUTDOORS; AND

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



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1 (2) IN WHICH CHILDREN ARE ENROLLED ON A REGULAR BASIS FOR 3 2 OR MORE HOURS PER DAY.

3 (C) "PILOT PROGRAM" MEANS THE OUTDOOR PRESCHOOL LICENSE PILOT
 4 PROGRAM.

5 **9.5–1102.**

6 (A) (1) THERE IS AN OUTDOOR PRESCHOOL LICENSE PILOT PROGRAM.

7 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADMINISTER THE PILOT PROGRAM.

8 (3) THE DEPARTMENT MAY CONVENE AN ADVISORY GROUP OF 9 OUTDOOR, NATURE-BASED EARLY LEARNING PRACTITIONERS TO INFORM AND 10 SUPPORT THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PILOT PROGRAM.

11(B)THE PURPOSE OF THE PILOT PROGRAM IS TO LICENSE OUTDOOR,12NATURE-BASED EARLY LEARNING AND CHILD CARE PROGRAMS IN ORDER TO:

13(1) EXPAND ACCESS TO AFFORDABLE, HIGH-QUALITY EARLY14LEARNING AND CHILD CARE PROGRAMS; AND

15 (2) INVESTIGATE THE BENEFITS OF OUTDOOR, NATURE-BASED 16 CLASSROOMS.

17 **9.5–1103.**

18 (A) (1) THE PILOT PROGRAM SHALL BEGIN ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 31, 19 2022, AND SHALL CONTINUE FOR 3 YEARS.

(2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SELECT BETWEEN 5 AND 10 OUTDOOR,
 NATURE-BASED EARLY LEARNING AND CHILD CARE PROGRAMS TO PARTICIPATE IN
 THE PILOT PROGRAM DURING THE FIRST YEAR OF THE PILOT PROGRAM.

23 (3) BEGINNING AUGUST 31, 2023, THE DEPARTMENT MAY SELECT 24 ADDITIONAL OUTDOOR, NATURE-BASED EARLY LEARNING AND CHILD CARE 25 PROGRAMS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROGRAM.

(B) WHEN SELECTING AND APPROVING OUTDOOR, NATURE-BASED EARLY
 LEARNING AND CHILD CARE PROGRAMS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROGRAM,
 THE DEPARTMENT:

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1 (1) SHALL GIVE PRIORITY TO EXISTING NATURE-BASED EARLY 2 LEARNING AND CHILD CARE PROGRAMS;

3 (2) SHALL SELECT A MIX OF RURAL, URBAN, AND SUBURBAN 4 PROGRAMS; AND

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(3) MAY GIVE PRIORITY TO:

6 (I) AREAS WHERE THERE ARE FEW OR LIMITED LICENSED 7 EARLY CHILD CARE PROGRAMS; AND

8 (II) AREAS OF NEED WHERE LICENSED EARLY CHILD CARE 9 PROGRAMS ARE AT OR NEAR FULL CAPACITY, AND WHERE ACCESS MAY BE 10 RESTRICTED BY ENROLLMENT WAITLISTS.

11 (C) THE DEPARTMENT MAY WAIVE OR ADAPT EXISTING CHILD CARE 12 LICENSING REQUIREMENTS TO ALLOW FOR THE OPERATION OF THE PILOT 13 PROGRAM.

15 THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADAPT THE MARYLAND EXCELS PROGRAM AS 16 NECESSARY FOR USE IN ASSESSING THE QUALITY OF OUTDOOR, NATURE–BASED 17 EARLY LEARNING AND CHILD CARE PROGRAMS.

18 **9.5–1105.**

(A) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 OF 2022 AND 2023, THE DEPARTMENT
 SHALL SUBMIT INTERIM REPORTS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH §
 2-1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE
 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PILOT PROGRAM, INCLUDING:

23 (1) THE NUMBER OF PARTICIPATING PROVIDERS IN THE PILOT 24 PROGRAM; AND

25 (2) THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES BEING SERVED BY THE
 26 PILOT PROGRAM.

(B) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2024, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT
A FINAL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE
STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE FINDINGS OF THE
PILOT PROGRAM, INCLUDING:

1 (1) A DISCUSSION OF POTENTIAL OPTIONS TO MITIGATE THE 2 UNCERTAINTY FOR FAMILIES AND PARTICIPATING PROVIDERS DURING THE FINAL **6** 3 MONTHS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM; AND

4 (2) RECOMMENDATIONS FOR MODIFYING OR EXPANDING THE PILOT 5 PROGRAM.

6 **9.5–1106.**

7 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS 8 SUBTITLE IN CONSULTATION WITH:

9 (1) THE EASTERN REGION ASSOCIATION OF FOREST AND NATURE 10 SCHOOLS;

11(2) THE OUTDOOR PRESCHOOL LICENSING AND ADVISORY TEAM;12AND

13(3)ANY OTHER STAKEHOLDERS THE DEPARTMENT CONSIDERS14NECESSARY.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 16 1, 2022. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and 6 months and, at the end of 17 December 31, 2025, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall 18 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
