An employer who violates this law is guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine not exceeding \$100." 26 27 Each application shall provide a space for an applicant to sign an

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- 1 (g) (1) Whenever the Commissioner determines that this section has been 2 violated, the Commissioner may:
 3 (i) try to resolve any issue involved in the violation informally by 4 mediation; or
- 5 (ii) ask the Attorney General to bring an action on behalf of the 6 applicant or employee.
- 7 (2) The Attorney General may bring an action under this section in the 8 county where the violation allegedly occurred, for injunctive relief, damages, or other relief.
- 9 (h) An employer who violates any provision of this section is guilty of a 10 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$100.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2022.
