SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Natural Resources

4 4–745.

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- (d) (2) (i) The Department may provide by regulation for issuance of an annual special Chesapeake Bay and coastal sport fishing license, which when permanently affixed to a boat registered in any state shall authorize any person on the boat to fish for finfish in the Chesapeake Bay or in its tributaries up to tidal boundaries or in State waters of the Atlantic Ocean and the Atlantic coastal bays and their tributaries, except that such a license may not be used on a boat that has been hired to take such persons fishing.
- 11 (ii) The annual fee for this special license shall be \$50.
 - (iii) If a boat owner purchases the special license under this paragraph, the boat owner may fish anywhere in the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries or the State waters of the Atlantic Ocean and the Atlantic coastal bays and their tributaries, whether the boat owner is fishing in the owner's boat, in another person's boat, on land, or elsewhere. The Department shall issue a complimentary Chesapeake Bay and coastal sport fishing license to the boat owner who purchases a special license under this paragraph. If a boat to which the special license is affixed has more than one owner, then only the individual applicant who signs the application for the special license shall be entitled to a complimentary Chesapeake Bay and coastal sport fishing license under this paragraph.
- 22 (3) (i) An individual shall register with the Department before fishing 23 in any of the following areas that do not require a Chesapeake Bay and coastal sport fishing 24 license:
- 25 1. A free fishing area established under § 4–214(b)(1) of this 26 title with hook and line;
- 27 2. On private real property bordering on tidal water as an owner or tenant of the property, or a spouse or an immediate family member who resides on the property with the owner or tenant; and
- 30 On a boat licensed under paragraph (2) of this subsection.
- 31 (ii) There is no fee for registration under this paragraph.
- 32 (iii) An individual required to register under this paragraph shall 33 provide all the information requested by the Department.

- 12 (3) IMPROVE REGISTRATION COMPLIANCE WITH THE FREE 13 REGISTRATION AUTHORIZED UNDER § 4–745(D)(3) OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 14 **(D)** TO MAINTAIN ELIGIBILITY TO PURCHASE A <u>CONSOLIDATED</u>
 15 CHESAPEAKE BAY AND COASTAL SPORT FISHING <u>BOAT</u> LICENSE, THE HOLDER OF
 16 THE LICENSE SHALL PROVIDE TO THE DEPARTMENT ALL INFORMATION REQUESTED
 17 UNDER SUBSECTION **(C)** OF THIS SECTION.
- 18 **(E)** THE DEPARTMENT SHALL TRACK ON A MONTHLY BASIS COSTS 19 ASSOCIATED WITH IMPLEMENTING THE PILOT PROGRAM.
- 20 (F) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2023, AND EACH DECEMBER 1
 21 THEREAFTER FOR THE DURATION OF THE PILOT PROGRAM, THE DEPARTMENT

- 29 (a) There is a Task Force on Recreational Fishing Data Collection and Licensing.
- 30 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:

- 1 at least eight representatives of tidal and nontidal recreational (1) 2 fisheries, designated by the Sport Fisheries Advisory Commission: 3 (2)representative of Morgan State University's Patuxent Environmental and Aquatic Research Laboratory (PEARL), designated by the Director of 4 5 PEARL: 6 one representative of the University of Maryland Center for (3) 7 Environmental Science (UMCES), designated by the President of UMCES; 8 **(4)** one representative of St. Mary's College of Maryland, designated by the President of St. Mary's College of Maryland; 9 10 one representative of the University of Maryland Eastern Shore, (5)designated by the President of the University of Maryland Eastern Shore; and 11 12 (6)the following members, appointed by the Secretary of Natural 13 Resources: 14 (i) at least one resource assessment statistician; and 15 (ii) at least one technical expert on coastal fisheries. 16 (c) The Secretary of Natural Resources shall designate the chair of the Task 17 Force. 18 The Department of Natural Resources shall provide staff for the Task Force. (d) A member of the Task Force: 19 (e) 20(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but 21is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget. 2223 The Task Force shall: (f)
- 24study methods for improving the accuracy of catch and effort estimates in recreational fisheries: 25
- 26 develop a multiyear plan for increasing the frequency of State and regional recreational fisheries surveys that are conducted in a manner that is equitable, 2728 inclusive, and statistically valid to all participants, such as online surveys, surveys mailed 29to a physical address, and telephone surveys;
- 30 study methods for improving surveying participants who are not frequently surveyed under current methods, including: 31

3		(iii)	anglers for whom English is a second language;
