 certain doula services, with certain limitations; and generally relating to the

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 18 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 19 INDICATED.
- 20 (2) "BIRTHING PARENT" MEANS THE INDIVIDUAL GIVING BIRTH AND 21 WHO IS RECEIVING DOULA SERVICES THROUGHOUT THE PARENT'S PREGNANCY 22 INCLUDING THE PRENATAL, LABOR, AND POSTPARTUM PERIODS.
- 23 (3) "CERTIFIED DOULA" MEANS A TRAINED NONMEDICAL



1 PROFESSIONAL WHO PROVIDES CONTINUOUS PHYSICAL, EMOTIONAL, AND 2 INFORMATIONAL SUPPORT TO THE BIRTHING PARENT THROUGHOUT THE 3 PRENATAL, LABOR, AND POSTPARTUM PERIODS WHO HAS RECEIVED A 4 CERTIFICATION TO PERFORM DOULA SERVICES APPROVED BY THE PROGRAM.

5 (4) "DOULA PROGRAM" MEANS THE MARYLAND MEDICAL 6 ASSISTANCE PROGRAM DOULA PROGRAM.

7 (5) "DOULA SERVICES" MEANS CONTINUOUS PHYSICAL, EMOTIONAL,
8 AND INFORMATIONAL SUPPORT, BASED ON EVIDENCED-BASED PRACTICES AND
9 WITH RESPECT FOR INDIVIDUAL CARE NEEDS, CULTURE, AND FAMILY TRADITIONS,
10 TO A BIRTHING PARENT PROVIDED BY A CERTIFIED DOULA, INCLUDING:

(I) EDUCATION AND GUIDANCE ON CHILDBIRTH, COPING
 SKILLS FOR NEW PARENTS, BREASTFEEDING, INFANT FEEDING, INFANT SOOTHING,
 AND MAKING INFORMED DECISIONS ABOUT CHILDBIRTH AND POSTPARTUM CARE;

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(II) **PRENATAL COUNSELING;**

15 (III) SUPPORT FOR OTHER INDIVIDUALS PROVIDING CARE FOR A 16 BIRTHING PARENT, INCLUDING A BIRTHING PARENT'S PARTNER AND FAMILY 17 MEMBERS; AND

18 (IV) FACILITATION OF ACCESS TO RESOURCES THAT CAN 19 IMPROVE BIRTH-RELATED OUTCOMES INCLUDING ONGOING HOME VISITING 20 SERVICES, TRANSPORTATION, HOUSING, THE SPECIAL SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION 21 PROGRAM FOR WOMEN, INFANTS AND CHILDREN, THE SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION 22 ASSISTANCE PROGRAM WIC, INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE RESOURCES, AND 23 ALCOHOL, TOBACCO, AND DRUG CESSATION.

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(6) "HOME" MEANS THE RESIDENCE OF THE BIRTHING PARENT.

(7) "LABOR AND DELIVERY" MEANS THE PERIOD DURING WHICH THE
FETUS, MEMBRANES, UMBILICAL CORD, AND PLACENTA ARE EXPELLED FROM THE
UTERUS THROUGH VAGINAL BIRTH OR THROUGH THE SURGICAL DELIVERY BY A
CESAREAN SECTION.

29(8) "MEDICALLY NECESSARY" MEANS THAT A SERVICE OR BENEFIT30 IS:

(I) DIRECTLY RELATED TO DIAGNOSTIC, PREVENTIVE,
 CURATIVE, PALLIATIVE, REHABILITATIVE, OR AMELIORATIVE TREATMENT OF AN
 ILLNESS, INJURY, DISABILITY, OR HEALTH CONDITION;

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1 (II) CONSISTENT WITH ACCEPTED STANDARDS OF GOOD 2 MEDICAL PRACTICE;

3(III) THE MOST COST-EFFICIENT SERVICE THAT CAN BE4PROVIDED WITHOUT SACRIFICING EFFECTIVENESS OR ACCESS TO CARE; AND

5 (IV) NOT PRIMARILY FOR THE CONVENIENCE OF A CONSUMER, 6 FAMILY, OR PROVIDER.

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(9) **"PARTICIPATING DOULA" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO:**

12 (10) "POSTPARTUM PERIOD" MEANS THE PERIOD WITHIN 180 DAYS 13 AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF LABOR AND DELIVERY.

(11) "PROVIDER" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL, AN ASSOCIATION, A
PARTNERSHIP, OR AN INCORPORATED OR UNINCORPORATED GROUP OF DOULAS
CERTIFIED TO PROVIDE DOULA SERVICES AND WHO, THROUGH AN APPROPRIATE
AGREEMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT, HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED AS A PROGRAM
PROVIDER BY THE ISSUANCE OF AN INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNT NUMBER.
