CHAPTER
AN ACT concerning
Property Tax Exemption – Disabled Veteran, Active Duty, and Surviving Spouse – Application Process
FOR the purpose of authorizing an individual to submit, and requiring the State Department of Assessments and Taxation to accept, an application for a certain property tax exemption for a dwelling house the individual intends to purchase before the individual purchases a the dwelling house; requiring the Departments within a certain period of time, to process the application and notify the applicant of approval or denial of the application send the applicant a certain letter within a certain period of time; and generally relating to a property tax exemption for a dwelling house owned by a disabled veteran, disabled active duty service member, or surviving spouse.

- 1 (d) (1) A disabled veteran or a surviving spouse of a disabled veteran shall 2 apply for an exemption under this section by providing to the supervisor: 3 a copy of the disabled veteran's discharge certificate from active military, naval, or air service; and 4 on the form provided by the Department, a certification of the 5 6 disabled veteran's disability from the Veterans' Administration. 7 The disabled veteran's certificate of disability may not be inspected by 8 individuals other than: 9 (i) the disabled veteran; or 10 appropriate employees of the State, a county, or a municipal (ii) 11 corporation. 12 A disabled active duty service member shall apply for an exemption under this section by providing to the supervisor, on the form provided by the Department. 13 a certification of the service member's disability from a physician licensed to practice 14 15 medicine in the State or from the Veterans' Administration. 16 A surviving spouse of an individual who died in the line of duty shall **(4)** apply for an exemption under this section by providing to the supervisor certification that 17 18 the individual died while in active service as a result of an injury or disease incurred in the line of duty. 19 20 **(5) (I)** AN INDIVIDUAL MAY SUBMIT, AND THE DEPARTMENT 21SHALL ACCEPT, AN APPLICATION FOR THE EXEMPTION UNDER THIS SECTION FOR A 22SPECIFIC DWELLING HOUSE THE INDIVIDUAL INTENDS TO PURCHASE BEFORE THE 23INDIVIDUAL PURCHASES & THE DWELLING HOUSE. 24THE DEPARTMENT, WITHIN 15 BUSINESS DAYS WITHIN 15 (II) 25BUSINESS DAYS FOLLOWING RECEIPT OF AN APPLICATION SUBMITTED UNDER 26 SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, SHALL PROCESS THE APPLICATION AND 27 NOTIFY THE APPLICANT OF THE APPROVAL OR DENIAL OF THE APPLICATION SEND 28 THE APPLICANT A LETTER STATING: 291. **THAT** THE APPLICATION IS **PRELIMINARILY** 30 APPROVED OR PRELIMINARILY DENIED; AND
- 31 <u>2. IF THE APPLICATION IS PRELIMINARILY APPROVED,</u>
 32 <u>THE AMOUNT OF THE TAX EXEMPTION FOR THE DWELLING THE INDIVIDUAL</u>
 33 INTENDS TO PURCHASE.
