1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Civil Actions – Tortious Injury or Death of Pet – Compensatory Damages**
3 **(Buddy’s Law)**

4 FOR the purpose of increasing the maximum amount of compensatory damages that may
5 be awarded to an owner of a pet from a person who tortiously causes an injury to or
6 death of the pet under certain circumstances; and generally relating to tortious
7 injury or death of pets.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Courts and Judicial Proceedings**

16 11–110.

17 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

18 (2) “Compensatory damages” means:

1 (i) In the case of the death of a pet, the fair market value of the pet
2 before death and the reasonable and necessary cost of veterinary care; and

3 (ii) In the case of an injury to a pet, the reasonable and necessary
4 cost of veterinary care.

5 (3) (i) "Pet" means a domesticated animal.

6 (ii) "Pet" does not include livestock.

7 (b) (1) A person who tortiously causes an injury to or death of a pet while
8 acting individually or through an animal under the person's ownership, direction, or control
9 is liable to the owner of the pet for compensatory damages.

10 (2) The damages awarded under paragraph (1) of this subsection may not
11 exceed [\$10,000] ~~\$25,000~~ \$15,000.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2022.
