BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Health - General 15–103. (b) The Department shall establish a delivery system for specialty (21)mental health services for enrollees of managed care organizations.
