- 21 (e) (1) On or before December 1, 2022, the workgroup shall submit an interim 22 report of its findings and recommendations, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State 23 Government Article, to the General Assembly.
- 24 (2) On or before December 1, 2023, the workgroup shall submit a final report of its findings and recommendations, including recommendations on the structure of a permanent advisory council and a permanent funding structure for the Maryland Loan Assistance Repayment Program Fund for Nurses and Nursing Workers Support Staff, to the General Assembly in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
