Vehicle Laws - Driver Education - Self-Paced, Online Instruction

- FOR the purpose of authorizing certain individuals to satisfy the classroom instruction component necessary for obtaining a provisional driver's license by completing certain self-paced, online driver education instruction approved by the Motor Vehicle Administration; requiring certain regulations adopted by the Administration to include standards for self-paced, online driver education instruction; and generally relating to self-paced, online driver education instruction.

6 7 8 9	(a) The Administration shall, in consultation with the State Department of Education, adopt and enforce regulations not inconsistent with this subtitle to implement a standardized driver education program conducted by driver education schools under its jurisdiction.
10 11	(b) Regulations adopted under this section shall be administered by the Administration and shall include:
12 13	(1) Curriculum, equipment, and facility standards for classroom laboratory, and on-road instruction phases;
14 15 16 17	(2) Minimum student performance standards for an approved driver education program based upon the standardized curriculum approved by the Administration, consisting of at least 30 hours of classroom OR SELF-PACED , ONLINE instruction and at least 6 hours of highway driving instruction;
18	(3) Standards for the certification of schools and instructors;
19	(4) A system to evaluate the effectiveness of the driver education program
20 21	(5) Standards governing the required offering of the driver education program, based on the capacity, enrollment, staff, and facilities of the schools; and
