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Local Health Departments, Environmental Health Specialists, and On-Site Sewage Disposal Systems – Systems Standards, Regulations, Applications, and Funding

5 FOR the purpose of requiring a database or system created by the Department of the 6 Environment for local health departments to be designed in a certain manner; 7 requiring the Department of the Environment to take certain actions regarding 8 applications and plans for the installation of on-site sewage disposal systems; 9 requiring the approving authority for an application for the installation of an on-site sewage disposal system to provide certain information to an applicant under certain 10 11 circumstances; requiring the Maryland Department of Health, in consultation with 12 the Department of the Environment, to promote certain standards and regulations, 13 develop certain statewide standards, and host certain informational meetings; 14 requiring the Governor, beginning in a certain fiscal year, to include in the annual 15 budget bill a certain appropriation to the Maryland Department of Health for 16 environmental health specialists; requiring the Department of the Environment to 17 adopt regulations on or before a certain date establishing that a certain requirement 18 regarding subsurface disposal of sewage applies to detached dwellings; and generally 19 relating to environmental health specialists and on-site sewage disposal systems.

- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2022.
