CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Washington County - Alcoholic Beverages Licenses - Wine

- FOR the purpose of altering references to "light wine" in alcoholic beverages licenses in Washington County to refer instead to "wine"; authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Washington County to issue a refillable container permit for wine to certain license holders; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Washington County.



Subtitle 7. [Light] Wine Licenses.

- 1 31–701.
- 2 (a) There is a Class A [light] wine license in the county.
- 3 (b) The license may be issued to a holder of a Class 3 winery license or a Class 4 4 limited winery license.
- 5 (c) (1) The license authorizes the license holder to sell at retail at the place 6 described in the license [light] wine produced at the winery.
- 7 (2) [Light wine] **WINE** shall be sold in a sealed package or container that 8 may not be opened or its contents consumed on the licensed premises.
- 9 (d) The annual license fee is \$50.
- Subtitle 8. Beer and [Light] Wine Licenses.
- 11 31-801.
- 12 (a) There is a Class A beer and [light] wine license.
- 13 (b) (1) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer and [light] wine, at retail, at the place described in the license.
- 15 (2) The license holder shall sell the beer and [light] wine in a sealed 16 package or container.
- 17 (3) The package or container may not be opened and its contents may not 18 be consumed on the premises where the beer or [light] wine is sold.
- 19 31-802.
- 20 (a) There is a Class B beer and [light] wine license.
- 21 (b) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer and [light] wine at a hotel 22 or restaurant, at retail, at the place described in the license, for on- and off-premises 23 consumption.
- 24 31-803.
- 25 (a) There is a Class B beer and [light] wine (on–sale only) license.
- 26 (b) (1) The Board may issue the license for use by a restaurant that:
- 27 (vi) serves food at all times whenever beer and [light] wine are being 28 served or consumed; and

- 2 (a) The following sections of Title 4, Subtitle 11 ("Additional License Privileges") 3 of Division I of this article apply in the county without exception or variation:
- 4 (1) § 4–1102 ("Corkage Consuming wine not purchased from license 5 holder on licensed premises"); and
- 6 (2) § 4–1103 ("Removal of partially consumed bottle of wine from licensed 7 premises").
- 8 (b) [Section 4–1105 ("Refillable container permit Wine") of Division I of this 9 article does not apply in the county.
- 10 (c) The following sections of Title 4, Subtitle 11 ("Additional License Privileges") 11 of Division I of this article apply in the county:
- 12 (1) § 4–1104 ("Refillable container permit Draft beer"), subject to § 13 31–1102 of this subtitle:
- 14 (2) § 4–1105 ("REFILLABLE CONTAINER PERMIT WINE"), SUBJECT 15 TO § 31–1102.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE; and
- 16 **[**(2)**] (3)** § 4–1106 ("Nonrefillable container permit Draft beer"), subject to **[**§ 31–1102.1**] § 31–1102.2** of this subtitle.
- 18 **31–1102.1.**
- 19 (A) THE BOARD MAY ISSUE A REFILLABLE CONTAINER PERMIT FOR WINE 20 TO A HOLDER OF A CLASS A WINE LICENSE.
- 21 (B) AN APPLICANT FOR THE PERMIT SHALL COMPLETE THE FORM THAT 22 THE BOARD PROVIDES.
- 23 (C) THE HOURS OF SALE FOR THE PERMIT:
- 24 (1) BEGIN AT THE SAME TIME AS THOSE FOR THE UNDERLYING 25 LICENSE; AND
- 26 (2) END AT MIDNIGHT.
- 27 (D) THE ANNUAL PERMIT FEE IS \$50.

- The Board may issue a nonrefillable container permit for draft beer to a holder 1 (a) 2 of a Class A license, a Class B license, or a Class D license. 3 (b) An applicant for the permit shall complete the form that the Board provides. 4 (c) The hours of sale for the permit: begin at the same time as those for the underlying license; and 5 (1) 6 end at midnight. (2) 7 (d) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the annual (1) permit fees are: 8 9 (i) \$50 for an applicant whose license has an off-sale privilege; and 10 (ii) \$500 for an applicant whose license does not have an off-sale 11 privilege. 12 (2) An applicant who has a refillable container permit may not be charged a fee for a nonrefillable container permit. 13 14 31-1502.15 The Board may not issue a Class A or Class D beer license, beer and [light] wine 16 license, or beer, wine, and liquor license to a person that holds an out-of-state alcoholic 17 beverages license. 18 31 - 1503. 19 Multiple licenses may be issued for the same premises or to an individual for the use 20 of that individual, a partnership, a corporation, an unincorporated association, or a limited 21liability company if:
- 22 (1) the licenses are Class D beer or Class D beer and [light] wine licenses;

- 24 (2) each premises is a bowling establishment that has at least 30 lanes with 25 automatic pinsetters.

- Notwithstanding § 31–1502 of this title, the Board may renew a Class A or Class D beer license, beer and [light] wine license, or beer, wine, and liquor license originally issued to a holder of an out–of–state alcoholic beverages license.


- 1 31-2003.2 A holder of a Class A beer and [light] wine license may sell beer and [light] (a) 3 wine: 4 (1) on Monday through Saturday, from 6 a.m. to 2 a.m. the following day; 5 and 6 (2) on Sunday, from 11 a.m. to midnight, if a fee is paid. 7 (b) (1) A holder of a Class B beer and [light] wine (on— and off-sale) license 8 may sell beer and [light] wine: 9 on Monday through Saturday, from 6 a.m. to 2 a.m. the following (i) 10 day; and except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, 11 (ii) on Sunday, from noon to midnight, if a fee is paid. 12 13 The license holder may sell beer and [light] wine on Sunday, from 11 a.m. to midnight, if: 14 the consumer places an order for a meal simultaneously with or 15 before placing an order for an alcoholic beverage; or 16 17 (ii) the consumer is entitled to a meal on the premises as part of a 18 prearranged event. 19 When a federal holiday falls on a Monday, the license holder may sell 20 beer and [light] wine on the Sunday immediately before the Monday holiday, from noon to 212 a.m. the following day. 22 A holder of a Class B beer and [light] wine (on-sale only) pouring 23license may sell beer and [light] wine: 24(i) on Monday through Saturday, from 6 a.m. to 2 a.m. the following day; and 2526 (ii) except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, 27on Sunday, from noon to midnight, if a fee is paid. 28 (2)The license holder may sell beer and [light] wine on Sunday, from 11 29 a.m. to midnight, if:
- 30 (i) the consumer places an order for a meal simultaneously with or 31 before placing an order for an alcoholic beverage; or

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2 a.m. the following day.



When a federal holiday falls on a Monday, the license holder may sell
