A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Health Care Commission – Studies of Issues Affecting Individuals With Sickle Cell Disease

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Health Care Commission, in consultation with 4 5 the Maryland Department of Health and certain experts and stakeholders, to 6 conduct studies on individuals who provide medical services in emergency 7 departments and their knowledge of sickle cell disease, the coordination of health 8 care for individuals with sickle cell disease who are transitioning from pediatric to 9 adult health care in the State, and Maryland Medical Assistance Program enrollees seeking medical care for sickle cell disease outside the State; requiring the 10 11 Commission to provide a copy of the report to a person on request; and generally 12 relating to studies regarding individuals with sickle cell disease.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 14 That:

- 15 (a) (1) The Maryland Health Care Commission, in consultation with the 16 Maryland Department of Health, experts in sickle cell disease, individuals who provide 17 medical care in emergency departments, and other stakeholders, shall conduct a study on 18 individuals who provide medical services in emergency departments in the State and their 19 knowledge of sickle cell disease.
- 20 (2) The study conducted under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall 21 examine:
- 22 (i) the extent and type of knowledge that individuals who provide 23 medical services in emergency departments in the State have about sickle cell disease;
- 24 (ii) the type of educational training individuals who provide medical 25 services in emergency departments receive regarding sickle cell disease, its treatment, and 26 how it may be affected by medical care; and



- 1 (iii) opportunities to educate individuals who provide medical services in emergency departments on sickle cell disease, including by requiring an individual to meet education requirements regarding sickle cell disease before being issued any certification required for providing medical care in an emergency department setting or as a component of continuing education.
- 6 (b) (1) The Maryland Health Care Commission, in consultation with the 7 Maryland Department of Health, experts in sickle cell disease, and other stakeholders, 8 shall conduct a study on the coordination of health care for individuals with sickle cell 9 disease who are transitioning from pediatric to adult health care in the State.
- 10 (2) The study conducted under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall 11 examine:
- 12 (i) resources available to individuals with sickle cell disease who are 13 transitioning from pediatric to adult health care in the State;
- 14 (ii) the type and frequency of actions taken by health care providers 15 in the State to coordinate health care for individuals with sickle cell disease who are 16 transitioning from pediatric to adult health care in the State; and
- 17 (iii) opportunities to enhance health care coordination for individuals 18 with sickle cell disease who are transitioning from pediatric to adult health care in the 19 State.
- (c) (1) The Maryland Health Care Commission, in consultation with the Maryland Department of Health, experts in sickle cell disease, Maryland Medical Assistance Program enrollees with sickle cell disease, and other stakeholders, shall conduct a study on Maryland Medical Assistance Program enrollees receiving out—of—state medical care for sickle cell disease.
- 25 (2) The study conducted under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall 26 examine, to the extent practicable:
- 27 (i) the number of Maryland Medical Assistance Program enrollees 28 receiving medical care for sickle cell disease outside the State, including as compared to the 29 total number of Program enrollees with sickle cell disease;
- 30 (ii) the reasons that Maryland Medical Assistance Program 31 enrollees seek medical care for sickle cell disease outside the State;
- 32 (iii) barriers to receiving medical care for sickle cell disease outside 33 the State for Maryland Medical Assistance Program enrollees; and
- 34 (iv) financial consequences of Maryland Medical Assistance Program 35 enrollees receiving care for sickle cell disease outside the State, both for the enrollees and

- 1 the Program.
- 2 (d) (1) On or before July 1, 2023, the Maryland Health Care Commission shall report its findings and recommendations resulting from the studies required under this section, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government Operations Committee.
- 7 (2) The Maryland Health Care Commission shall provide a copy of the 8 report under paragraph (1) of this subsection to any person on request.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 10 1, 2022.
