- 2 (A) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF 25 MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE 3 GOVERNOR WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE.
- 4 (B) (1) OF THE 25 MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION:
- 5 (I) 12 SHALL BE APPOINTED FROM AMONG APPLICANTS WHO
- 6 HAVE BEEN NOMINATED AND RECOMMENDED FOR APPOINTMENT BY
- 7 ORGANIZATIONS LOCATED IN THE STATE WHOSE MISSIONS INCLUDE A FOCUS ON
- 8 FATHERHOOD OR SUPPORTING FATHERS; AND

- 29 enacted.
