### 2 Pharmacists – Status as Health Care Providers and <u>Study on</u> Reimbursement

FOR the purpose of altering <u>a</u> certain <del>definitions</del> <u>definition</u> of "health care provider" to 3 include pharmacists for the purposes of provisions of law related to health care 4  $\mathbf{5}$ malpractice elaims, the destruction of medical records, and HIV testing; requiring 6 the Maryland Medical Assistance Program, the Maryland Children's Health 7 Program, and certain insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and health maintenance organizations to provide coverage for certain services rendered by a 8 9 licensed pharmacist if the coverage is provided for the same services rendered by any 10 other health care practitioner and the services are within the scope of practice of the 11 licensed pharmacist requiring the Maryland Insurance Commissioner to establish a workgroup to identify options and requirements necessary for the reimbursement of 12 13pharmacists and submit a report to certain committees on or before a certain date;
