A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Public Schools – Health and Vision Services – Required Screenings and Eye Examinations

- 4 FOR the purpose of altering the requirements for vision screenings for students in public $\mathbf{5}$ schools; requiring a certain health form to include space for certain information; 6 requiring a county board of education to ensure that certain students receive an eye 7 examination and eyeglasses under certain circumstances and in coordination with 8 certain programs, if necessary; requiring a county board or county health 9 department to provide students with certain information when the student registers for school; establishing the Pediatric Vision Program; establishing the Vision for 10 11 Maryland Program; requiring the Maryland State School Health Council to evaluate 12how the Council can partner with various stakeholders to address certain issues; 13 requiring the State Department of Education and the Maryland Department of 14 Health to examine and report on certain auditory support programs; and generally 15relating to health and vision services for students in public schools.
