A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning 2 Youth Sports Safety Advisory Commission FOR the purpose of establishing the Youth Sports Safety Advisory Commission to study 3 and make recommendations to minimize risk and maximize safety for youth 4 5 athletes; and generally relating to the Youth Sports Safety Advisory Commission. 6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 7 That: 8 There is a Youth Sports Safety Advisory Commission. (a) 9 (b) The Commission consists of the following members: 10 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate: 11 12 (2)one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the 13 House: the State Superintendent of Schools, or the State Superintendent's 14 (3) 15 designee; 16 the following members who have experience with youth sports safety or 17 treating youth sports injuries, appointed by the Governor on or before February 19, 2023: 18 (i) one representative of the Maryland Chapter of the American 19 Academy of Pediatrics: 20 one representative of the Maryland Academy of Family (ii) 21 Physicians;

- 7 (g) On or before December 31, 2023, the Commission shall submit a report of its 8 findings and recommendations to the Governor, the State Board of Education, the 9 Maryland Department of Health, and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government 10 Article, the General Assembly.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect January 1, 2023. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of December 31, 2027, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
