3 4 5 6	FOR the purpose of prohibiting a State or local entity from requiring any additional immunizations for a child entering school other than the immunizations required by the Maryland Department of Health; and generally relating to immunizations and public school students.

12 13	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
14	Article – Education

16 17 18	(a) (1) In cooperation with the State Board and the Maryland State Medical Society, the Maryland Department of Health shall adopt rules and regulations regarding blood tests for lead poisoning required of children entering schools.
19 20 21	(2) (I) In cooperation with the State Board and the Statewide Advisory Commission on Immunizations, the Maryland Department of Health shall adopt rules and regulations regarding immunizations required of children entering schools.



- (II) A STATE OR LOCAL ENTITY MAY NOT REQUIRE ANY ADDITIONAL IMMUNIZATIONS FOR A CHILD ENTERING SCHOOL, EXCEPT FOR THOSE IMMUNIZATIONS REQUIRED UNDER THE RULES AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH.
- 6 (3) These rules and regulations shall:
- 7 (i) Be adopted in compliance with the Administrative Procedure 8 Act;
- 9 (ii) Provide that any child may have the immunization administered 10 by his personal physician; and
- 11 (iii) 1. By September 2003, in areas designated as at risk for lead poisoning, as determined under § 18–106 of the Health – General Article, when a child 12 13 enters a public prekindergarten program, kindergarten program, or first grade, require the parent or legal guardian of the child to provide documentation from a health care provider, 14 on a form developed by the Maryland Department of Health, certifying that the child has 15 16 undergone blood testing for lead poisoning administered in accordance with the guidelines 17 of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in the screening of young children for lead poisoning: Guidance for State and Local Public Health Officials (November 1997) and 18 19 any subsequent guidelines; and
- 20 By September 2003, require a program or school to report 21 the name, last known address, and telephone number of each child for whom certified 22 documentation of a lead test is not provided under item 1 of this item, as determined by 23 regulation, to the local health department in the jurisdiction where the child resides.
- 24 (4) Any requirement for the administration of pertussis vaccine shall be 25 consistent with § 18–332(b) of the Health General Article.
- 26 (b) (1) Unless the Secretary of Health declares an emergency or an epidemic 27 of disease, a child whose parent or guardian objects to immunization on the ground that it 28 conflicts with the parent's or guardian's bona fide religious beliefs and practices may not 29 be required to present a physician's certification of immunization in order to be admitted 30 to school.
- 31 (2) The Secretary of Health shall adopt rules and regulations for religious 32 exemptions under this subsection.
- 33 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
