Motor Vehicles - Driver's License and Insurance Offenses - Penalties

- FOR the purpose of altering and repealing certain penalties for certain motor vehicle offenses related to driver's licenses or the privilege to drive in the State; altering and repealing certain penalties for driving, or knowingly allowing another person to drive, under certain circumstances, a motor vehicle that is not covered by the required security; and generally relating to penalties for motor vehicle offenses related to driver's licenses and insurance requirements.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

- 18 (a) A person may not drive a motor vehicle on any highway or on any property specified in § 21–101.1 of this article while the person's license or privilege to drive is refused in this State or any other state.
- 21 (b) A person may not drive a motor vehicle on any highway or on any property 22 specified in § 21–101.1 of this article while the person's license or privilege to drive is 23 canceled in this State.
- 24 (c) A person may not drive a motor vehicle on any highway or on any property

- A person may not drive a motor vehicle on any highway or on any property 9 (f) specified in § 21–101.1 of this article while the person's license issued by any other state is 10 suspended. 11
- 12 A person may not drive a motor vehicle on any highway or on any property (g) 13 specified in § 21–101.1 of this article while the person's license issued by any other state is 14 revoked.
- 15 A person may not drive a motor vehicle on any highway or on any property specified in § 21–101.1 of this article while the person's license or privilege to drive is 16 17 suspended under § 16-203, § 16-206(a)(2) for failure to attend a driver improvement 18 program, § 17–106, § 26–204, § 26–206, or § 27–103 of this article.
- 19 This subsection applies only to a person whose license or privilege to (i) 20 drive is suspended under the traffic laws or regulations of another state for:
- 21(i) Failure to comply with a notice to appear in a court of that state 22contained in a traffic citation issued to the person; or
- 23(ii) Failure to pay a fine for a violation of any traffic laws or 24regulations of that state.
- (2)A person may not drive a motor vehicle on any highway or on any property specified in § 21–101.1 of this article while the person's license or privilege to drive 26is suspended under the traffic laws or regulations of any other state as described in paragraph (1) of this subsection. 28
