BY adding to Article - Transportation Section 13-619.4 Annotated Code of Maryland (2020 Replacement Volume and 2021 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article – Transportation** 13-619.4. (A) **(1)** THE ADMINISTRATION MAY ESTABLISH A PILOT PROGRAM TO EVALUATE THE USE OF ALTERNATIVES TO THE VEHICLE REGISTRATION PLATES AND CARDS THAT ARE OTHERWISE REQUIRED UNDER THIS TITLE.

- 1 (2) SUBSECTIONS (B) THROUGH (D) OF THIS SECTION APPLY ONLY IF 2 THE ADMINISTRATION ESTABLISHES A PILOT PROGRAM UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
- 3 (B) (1) THE ADMINISTRATION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE 4 DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE, SHALL DEVELOP AND MAKE AVAILABLE 5 ALTERNATIVES TO TRADITIONAL VEHICLE REGISTRATION PLATES AND CARDS.
- 6 (2) THE OWNER OF A CLASS A (PASSENGER) ZERO-EMISSION 7 ELECTRIC VEHICLE MAY APPLY TO THE ADMINISTRATION FOR AN ALTERNATIVE 8 VEHICLE REGISTRATION PLATE AND CARD.
- 9 (3) NOT MORE THAN 0.5% OF CLASS A (PASSENGER) ZERO-EMISSION
  10 ELECTRIC VEHICLES REGISTERED IN THE STATE MAY PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT
  11 PROGRAM.
- 12 (4) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY NOT REQUIRE A ZERO-EMISSION
  13 ELECTRIC VEHICLE OWNER TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROGRAM.
- 14 (C) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL COMPLETE THE PILOT PROGRAM BY JULY 15 1, 2027.
- 16 (D) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2027, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL
  17 REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE
  18 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE SENATE JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS COMMITTEE AND
  19 THE HOUSE ENVIRONMENT AND TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE ON THE RESULTS
  20 OF THE PILOT PROGRAM, INCLUDING:
- 21 (1) AN EVALUATION OF COST-EFFECTIVENESS OF THE ALTERNATIVE 22 VEHICLE REGISTRATION PLATES AND CARDS COMPARED TO TRADITIONAL VEHICLE 23 REGISTRATION PLATES AND CARDS; AND
- 24 (2) RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ANY LEGISLATIVE OR REGULATORY 25 CHANGES NECESSARY BASED ON THE FINDINGS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2022. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 years and, at the end of June 30, 2028, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
