A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Labor and Employment – Workforce Development – Cybersecurity

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Cybersecurity Workforce Accelerator Program at the 4 University of Maryland Baltimore County to increase the cybersecurity workforce in $\mathbf{5}$ the State, increase the investment of the State in cybersecurity workforce programs 6 and educational programs at certain institutions, and for other purposes related to 7 the cybersecurity workforce in the State; requiring the Department of Commerce and 8 the Maryland Department of Labor to assist in administering the Accelerator 9 Program as necessary; establishing the Cybersecurity Workforce Accelerator Fund; and generally relating to the Cybersecurity Workforce Accelerator and cybersecurity 1011 workforce programs.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "ACCELERATOR PROGRAM" MEANS THE 22 CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM.

23 (B) THERE IS A CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM 24 AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND BALTIMORE COUNTY.

(5) WORK WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE TO INCREASE
 DEMAND-SIDE PLANNING TO IDENTIFY THE SPECIFIC AND REAL-TIME NEEDS OF
 CYBERSECURITY EMPLOYERS IN THE STATE, INCLUDING BY:

12 (5) PROVIDE COORDINATION BETWEEN INSTITUTIONS THAT PROVIDE 13 ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION AND INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER 14 EDUCATION TO PREPARE STUDENTS FOR ENTRANCE INTO THE CYBERSECURITY 15 WORKFORCE.

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(6) WORK WITH THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO:

10 (I) ESTABLISH A SUMMER K–12 TEACHER EXTERNSHIP GRANT 11 PROGRAM TO PROVIDE TEACHERS WITH PAID EXTERNSHIPS OVER THE SUMMER TO 12 APPRENTICE AT CYBERSECURITY COMPANIES AND PARTICIPATE IN TRAINING 13 OPPORTUNITIES AVAILABLE AT FACILITIES THAT PROVIDE CYBERSECURITY RANGE 14 TRAINING; AND

15 (II) DEVELOP AND INVEST IN EDUCATIONAL AND CAREER 16 PATHWAYS IN CYBERSECURITY THAT MEET THE COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS 17 STANDARD ADOPTED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION UNDER § 7–205.1 OF 18 THE EDUCATION ARTICLE;

19 (7) WORK WITH THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF LABOR TO GROW 20 THE MARYLAND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT RIGHT NOW FOR CYBERSECURITY 21 PROGRAMS AND THE MARYLAND APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING PROGRAM FOR 22 CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT;

(8) PRODUCE, IN CONSULTATION WITH STAKEHOLDERS, A STRATEGIC
 ROADMAP TO FILL AVAILABLE CYBERSECURITY POSITIONS BY CALENDAR YEAR
 2025;

26 **(9)** WORK WITH APPROPRIATE PARTNERS TO PROVIDE 27 CYBERSECURITY RANGE TRAINING AT ALL LEVELS;

(10) EXPAND THE MARYLAND TECHNOLOGY INTERNSHIP PROGRAM
 TO INCLUDE UNITS OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT; AND

30(11) ADMINISTER THE CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE ACCELERATOR31FUND.

(1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "FUND" MEANS THE CYBERSECURITY 1 **(E)** $\mathbf{2}$ WORKFORCE ACCELERATOR FUND. (2) THERE IS A CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE ACCELERATOR FUND. 3 THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO SUPPORT INNOVATIVE (3) 4 APPROACHES TO MEETING CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE NEEDS. 56 (4) THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM SHALL ADMINISTER THE FUND. 7 THE FUND IS A SPECIAL, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT (5) **(I)** SUBJECT TO § 7-302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE. 8 9 THE STATE TREASURER SHALL HOLD THE FUND **(II)** 10 SEPARATELY, AND THE COMPTROLLER SHALL ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND. THE FUND CONSISTS OF: 11 (6) MONEY APPROPRIATED IN THE STATE BUDGET TO THE 12 **(I)** FUND; AND 1314**(II)** ANY OTHER MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE ACCEPTED FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE FUND. 1516 THE FUND MAY BE USED ONLY FOR: (7) 17**(I)** ADMINISTRATION OF THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM; AND 18**(II)** PROVIDING GRANTS TO ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS, INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION, AND NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS 19 TO OPERATE CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS. 2021(8) **(I)** THE STATE TREASURER SHALL INVEST THE MONEY OF THE 22FUND IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STATE MONEY MAY BE INVESTED. 23(II) ANY INTEREST EARNINGS OF THE FUND SHALL BE CREDITED TO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE. 2425(9) EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND MAY BE MADE ONLY IN 26ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE BUDGET.

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1 (10) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024 AND 2025, THE GOVERNOR SHALL 2 INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF \$2,000,000 FOR THE 3 FUND.

4 (F) THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND THE DEPARTMENT SHALL 5 ASSIST IN ADMINISTERING THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM AS NECESSARY.

6 (G) FOR EACH FISCAL YEAR, THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE 7 ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF:

8 (1) \$1,000,000 TO THE MARYLAND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT 9 RIGHT NOW FOR CYBERSECURITY PROGRAMS AND ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT;

10(2) \$1,000,000 TO THE MARYLAND APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING11PROGRAM FOR CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT AND12ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT;

(3) \$450,000 TO THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND BALTIMORE
COUNTY TO FUND THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM, INCLUDING \$250,000 TO BE USED
FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUBSECTION (D)(5)(II) OF THIS SECTION;

16 (4) \$2,500,000 TO THE CYBER WARRIOR DIVERSITY PROGRAM;

17 (5) \$500,000 TO FUND THE SUMMER K–12 TEACHER EXTERNSHIP 18 GRANT PROGRAM REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (D)(6) OF THIS SECTION;

19 (6) \$1,000,000 FOR THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF MARYLAND TO 20 DEVELOP CYBER RANGE SCENARIOS BASED ON INDUSTRY DEMAND;

21 (7) \$500,000 TO FUND EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES ABOUT 22 CYBERSECURITY CAREERS IN ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION; AND

23 (8) \$500,000 FOR THE MARYLAND TECHNOLOGY INTERNSHIP 24 PROGRAM.

(H) THE APPROPRIATIONS REQUIRED TO BE INCLUDED IN THE ANNUAL
BUDGET BILL UNDER SUBSECTIONS (E)(10) AND (G) OF THIS SECTION ARE
SUPPLEMENTAL TO AND ARE NOT INTENDED TO TAKE THE PLACE OF FUNDING THAT
OTHERWISE WOULD BE APPROPRIATED FOR THOSE PURPOSES.

(I) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 EACH YEAR, THE UNIVERSITY OF
 MARYLAND BALTIMORE COUNTY, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT AND
 THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT ON THE OPERATION

1 AND PERFORMANCE OF THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN

- 2 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL 3 ASSEMBLY.
- 4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 5 1, 2022.
