1 AN ACT concerning

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Greater Baltimore Transit Governance and Funding Commission

- FOR the purpose of establishing the Greater Baltimore Transit Governance and Funding
 Commission to study and make findings and recommendations relating to the
 funding, governance, and performance of mass transit in the greater Baltimore
 region; and generally relating to the Greater Baltimore Transit Governance and
 Funding Commission and mass transit.
- 8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 9 That:
- 10 (a) In this section, "Commission" means the Greater Baltimore Transit 11 Governance and Funding Commission.
- 12 (b) There is a Greater Baltimore Transit Governance and Funding Commission.
- 13 (c) (1) The Commission consists of the following members:
- 14 (i) One member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the 15 President of the Senate;
- 16 (ii) One member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker 17 of the House:
- 18 (iii) One individual who is an expert in mass transit issues in the 19 greater Baltimore region, appointed by the Governor; and
- 20 (iv) Three individuals from Baltimore City, two individuals from 21 Baltimore County, and one individual from Anne Arundel County, each of whom shall:

- 3 (h) (1) On or before December 1, 2022, the Commission shall submit an interim 4 report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 5 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
- 6 (2) On or before December 1, 2023, the Commission shall submit a final report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 10 1, 2022. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 7 months and, at the end of 11 December 31, 2023, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall 12 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
