2 Public Schools – Reporting of Sexual Misconduct, Stalking, and Harassment (Report Act of 2022)

- FOR the purpose of requiring a school administration to file an administrative incident report if sexual misconduct, stalking, or harassment is reported to the school administration; requiring the school administration to provide a copy of the administrative incident report to the victim and the parent of the victim; requiring each county board of education to adopt a policy specifying the penalty for a violation of this Act; and generally relating to public schools and the reporting of sexual misconduct, stalking, and harassment.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 21 INDICATED.
- 22 (2) (I) "HARASSMENT" MEANS FOLLOWING A PERSON IN OR ABOUT
- 23 A PUBLIC PLACE OR MALICIOUSLY ENGAGING IN A COURSE OF CONDUCT THAT
- 24 ALARMS OR SERIOUSLY ANNOYS ANOTHER:

3 4	2. AFTER RECEIVING A REASONABLE WARNING OR REQUEST TO STOP BY OR ON BEHALF OF THE OTHER; AND
5	3. WITHOUT A LEGAL PURPOSE.
6 7 8	(II) "HARASSMENT" DOES NOT INCLUDE A PEACEABLE ACTIVITY INTENDED TO EXPRESS A POLITICAL VIEW OR PROVIDE INFORMATION TO OTHERS.
9 10	(3) "SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION" MEANS A PRINCIPAL OF A PUBLIC SCHOOL OR A DESIGNEE OF THE PRINCIPAL.
11 12	(4) "SEXUAL MISCONDUCT" MEANS AN ACT PUNISHABLE UNDER TITLE 3, SUBTITLE 3 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE.
13 14	(5) "STALKING" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 3–802 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE.
15 16	(B) IF SEXUAL MISCONDUCT, STALKING, OR HARASSMENT IS REPORTED TO A SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION, THE SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION SHALL:
17 18	(1) FILE AN ADMINISTRATIVE INCIDENT REPORT WITH THE COUNTY BOARD THAT INCLUDES:
19	(I) THE NAME OF THE PERSON WRITING THE REPORT;
20	(II) THE TIME AND DATE OF THE INCIDENT;
21	(III) THE LOCATION OF THE INCIDENT;
22	(IV) A DESCRIPTION OF THE INCIDENT;
23	(V) A RECORD OF INJURIES AND DAMAGES;
24	(VI) THE NAME OF ANY WITNESSES; AND
25	(VII) STATEMENTS OF ANY WITNESSES; AND
26	(2) PROVIDE A COPY OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE INCIDENT REPORT TO:

- 1 (I) THE VICTIM OF THE SEXUAL MISCONDUCT, STALKING, OR 2 HARASSMENT; AND
- 3 (II) IF THE VICTIM OF THE SEXUAL MISCONDUCT, STALKING, OR 4 HARASSMENT IS A STUDENT, THE PARENT OF THE STUDENT.
- 5 (C) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL:
- 6 (1) ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT SPECIFY THE REQUIREMENTS OF AN 7 ADMINISTRATIVE INCIDENT REPORT FILED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS 8 SECTION;
- 9 (2) ADOPT A POLICY THAT SPECIFIES THE PENALTY FOR A VIOLATION
 10 OF ANY PROVISION OF THIS SECTION, UP TO AND INCLUDING TERMINATION OF
 11 EMPLOYMENT; AND
- 12 (3) WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE FINAL DAY OF EACH SCHOOL YEAR, 13 REPORT THE TOTAL NUMBER OF ADMINISTRATIVE INCIDENT REPORTS FILED 14 UNDER THIS SECTION TO THE DEPARTMENT.
- 15 (D) WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER THE FINAL DAY OF EACH SCHOOL YEAR, THE
 16 DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH
 17 § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE TOTAL NUMBER OF
 18 ADMINISTRATIVE INCIDENT REPORTS FILED UNDER THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
