1 AN ACT concerning

Public Health - Packaged Ice - Testing

- FOR the purpose of requiring a person who manufactures packaged ice for sale in the State to conduct a test on the final packaged ice product for contamination with certain frequency, maintain a record of the test results for a certain period of time, provide the test results on request by a representative of the Maryland Department of Health, and follow certain procedures if the test shows that the packaged ice is not safe for human consumption; and generally relating to testing packaged ice.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 18 (A) A PERSON WHO MANUFACTURES PACKAGED ICE FOR SALE IN THE 19 STATE SHALL:
- 20 (1) AT LEAST ONCE DURING EACH 3-MONTH PERIOD, TEST THE FINAL
- 21 PACKAGED ICE PRODUCT FOR CONTAMINATION IN A MANNER DETERMINED BY THE
- 22 DEPARTMENT TO ENSURE THAT THE ICE IS SAFE FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION;

- 14 ICE THAT A MANUFACTURER MUST MEET THAT ARE AT LEAST AS STRINGENT AS
- 15 FEDERAL AND STATE STANDARDS FOR SELLING ICE IN THE STATE;
- 16 (2) REQUIREMENTS FOR TESTING CONDUCTED UNDER SUBSECTION
- 17 (A) OF THIS SECTION; AND
- 18 (3) A PROCEDURE CONSISTENT WITH § 21–211 OF THIS SUBTITLE TO
- 19 BE FOLLOWED BY THE DEPARTMENT AND A MANUFACTURER IF THE RESULTS OF A
- 20 TEST CONDUCTED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHOW THAT THE
- 21 PACKAGED ICE IS NOT SAFE FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION.
