A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

State Procurement – Small Business Reserve Program

- FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "small business" for the purposes of the Small
 Business Reserve Program by adding a requirement that the principal office of the
 business must be located in the State; increasing the minimum percent of a unit's
 procurements that, to the extent practicable, are to be made directly from small
 businesses; altering the intervals within which certain standards and guidelines for
 participation in the Small Business Reserve Program are required to be established;
 and generally relating to the Small Business Reserve Program.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
 - Article State Finance and Procurement

- 19 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 20 (b) "Small business" means:

(1) a certified minority business enterprise, as defined in § 14–301 of this
title, that meets the criteria specified under item (3) of this subsection;



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$\frac{1}{2}$	(2) a veteran-owned small business enterprise, as defined in § 14–601 of this title, that meets the criteria specified under item (3) of this subsection; or
3	(3) a business, other than a broker, that meets the following criteria:
4	(i) the business is independently owned and operated;
5	(ii) the business is not a subsidiary of another business;
6	(iii) the business is not dominant in its field of operation; [and]
7 8	(iv) THE BUSINESS'S PRINCIPAL OFFICE IS LOCATED IN THE STATE; AND

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E. the gross sales of the construction operations of the business did not exceed an average of \$7,000,000 in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years; and

F. the gross sales of the architectural and engineering services of the business did not exceed an average of \$4,500,000 in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years.

7 (c) "Small business reserve" means those procurements that are limited to 8 responses from small businesses under § 14–502(b) of this subtitle.

10 (a) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, this subtitle applies to all 11 procurements by a unit.

12 (b) This subsection does not apply to procurements subject to Subtitle 1 of this 13 title.

14 (c) To the extent practicable, a unit shall structure its procurement procedures to 15 achieve a minimum of [15%] **30%** of the unit's total dollar value of goods, supplies, services, 16 maintenance, construction, construction–related services, and architectural and 17 engineering service contracts to be made directly to small businesses.

18 (d) The total dollar value of procurements by a unit does not include the value of 19 contracts to which this section does not apply because of a conflict with federal law.

20 (e) A unit may apply toward the unit's overall annual Small Business Reserve 21 payment achievement only those payments resulting from a procurement that is 22 designated a Small Business Reserve procurement.

(f) The Special Secretary for the Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business
Affairs, in consultation with the Attorney General, shall establish standards and guidelines
for participation in the Small Business Reserve Program AT LEAST every 5 years.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 October 1, 2022.
