14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
15	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19	IN THIS SUBTITLE, "STANDING ORDER" MEANS A WRITTEN AND SIGNED
20	PROTOCOL AUTHORED BY ONE OR MORE PHYSICIANS OR ADVANCED PRACTICE
21	REGISTERED NURSES LICENSED UNDER THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE.



- 1 (A) A LICENSED PHYSICIAN OR AN ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED 2 NURSE WITH PRESCRIBING AUTHORITY MAY PRESCRIBE IVERMECTIN BY ISSUING A
- 3 STANDING ORDER.
- 4 A STANDING ORDER ISSUED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION (B) 5 SHALL:
- 6 SPECIFY A PROTOCOL THAT ALLOWS PHARMACISTS LICENSED 7 UNDER THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE TO DISPENSE IVERMECTIN;
- 8 SPECIFY A MECHANISM TO DOCUMENT SCREENING PERFORMED 9 OF THE PATIENT AND THE PRESCRIPTION IN THE PATIENT'S MEDICAL RECORD; AND
- **(3)** 10 INCLUDE A PLAN FOR EVALUATING AND TREATING ADVERSE 11 EVENTS.
- 12 A PRESCRIPTIONS WRITTEN UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE REGARDED 13 AS BEING WRITTEN FOR A LEGITIMATE MEDICAL PURPOSE IN THE USUAL COURSE 14 OF PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE.
- 15 A PHARMACIST LICENSED UNDER THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE 16 FOLLOWING A STANDING ORDER ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY DISPENSE IVERMECTIN TO INDIVIDUALS IN THE STATE WITHOUT A PRIOR PRESCRIPTION. 17
- 18 A PHARMACIST, A PHARMACY, A PHYSICIAN, OR AN ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE ISSUING OR FOLLOWING A STANDING ORDER ISSUED 19 20 UNDER THIS SECTION MAY NOT SEEK A RELATED PERSONAL FINANCIAL BENEFIT BY:
- PARTICIPATING IN ANY INCENTIVE-BASED PROGRAM; OR 21**(1)**
- 22**(2)** ACCEPTING ANY INDUCEMENT THAT INFLUENCES \mathbf{OR} 23ENCOURAGES THERAPEUTIC OR PRODUCT CHANGES OR THE ORDERING OF TESTS 24OR SERVICES.
- 25**(F)** A PHARMACIST SHALL PROVIDE EACH INDIVIDUAL WHO IS 26 DISPENSED IVERMECTIN UNDER THIS SECTION WITH A STANDARDIZED 27INFORMATION SHEET WRITTEN IN PLAIN LANGUAGE.
- 28**(2)** THE STANDARDIZED INFORMATION SHEET SHALL INCLUDE THE 29 IMPORTANCE OF FOLLOW-UP CARE AND HEALTH CARE REFERRAL INFORMATION.
- 30 THE INFORMATION SHEET MAY NOT DISCOURAGE THE RECIPIENT **(3)** FROM USING IVERMECTIN FOR THE TREATMENT OF COVID-19. 31

- 1 (G) (1) THE STATE BOARD OF PHYSICIANS MAY NOT DENY, REVOKE, OR
 2 SUSPEND THE LICENSE OF OR OTHERWISE TAKE DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST A
 3 PHYSICIAN BASED ON A PHARMACIST'S FAILURE TO FOLLOW A STANDING ORDER
 4 ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION IF THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION ARE
 5 SATISFIED BY THE PHYSICIAN.
- 6 (2) THE STATE BOARD OF NURSING MAY NOT DENY, REVOKE, OR
 7 SUSPEND THE LICENSE OF OR OTHERWISE TAKE DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST AN
 8 ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE BASED ON A PHARMACIST'S FAILURE TO
 9 FOLLOW A STANDING ORDER ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION IF THE REQUIREMENTS
 10 OF THIS SECTION ARE SATISFIED BY THE ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE.
- 11 (3) THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY MAY NOT DENY, REVOKE, OR
 12 SUSPEND THE LICENSE OF OR OTHERWISE TAKE DISCIPLINARY AGAINST A
 13 PHARMACIST WHO FOLLOWS A STANDING ORDER ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION
 14 BASED ON A DEFECT IN THE STANDING ORDER IF THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS
 15 SECTION ARE OTHERWISE SATISFIED BY THE PHARMACIST.
- 16 (H) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS 17 SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2022.
