$2 \\ 3$	WHEREAS, The Tuskegee Airmen were a group of African American military pilots who served the United States with distinction during World War II; and
4 5	WHEREAS, The Tuskegee Airmen overcame a history of harsh segregation and rigid social barriers to serve in meaningful roles in defense of our country; and
$6 \\ 7$	WHEREAS, Recognition of the Tuskegee Airmen's valiant and amazing feats during and after World War II was slow in arriving; and
8 9 10	WHEREAS, Several Tuskegee Airmen have special ties to Maryland, some of whom currently reside in Maryland and others who resided in Maryland at other times, having contributed richly to the culture of our State; and
$\begin{array}{c} 11\\ 12\\ 13\end{array}$	WHEREAS, The East Coast Chapter Tuskegee Airmen, Incorporated, provides \$15,000 annually to graduating high school seniors and college students in need of tuition assistance as well as over \$20,000 of scholarship awards towards aviation classes; and
14 15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, The month of March is special in the history of the Tuskegee Airmen because it is the month that the first aviation cadets completed pilot training and received their wings; the first aircraft maintenance crews began training at Chanute Field, Rantoul, Illinois; the first squadron was activated; and President George W. Bush presented the Tuskegee Airmen with the Congressional Gold Medal on March 27, 2007; now, therefore,
