CHAPTER
AN ACT concerning
Pharmacists – Administration of Maintenance Injectable Medications – Medications for Treatment of Sexually Transmitted Infections
FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "maintenance injectable medication" for the purposes of provisions of law governing the administration of maintenance injectable
medications by pharmacists to include a medication that treats a sexually
transmitted infection and is not a vaccine defining "injectable medications for
treatment of sexually transmitted infections" for the purposes of authorizing
pharmacists to administer the medications; requiring certain insurers, nonprofit
health service plans, health maintenance organizations, the Maryland Medical
Assistance Program, and the Maryland Children's Health Program to provide certain
coverage for the administration of the medication by a pharmacist; and generally
relating to the administration of maintenance injectable medications by
pharmacists.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, to the extent determined appropriate by the State Board of Pharmacy, the regulations adopted by the State Board of 4 Pharmacy, in consultation with the State Board of Physicians and the State Board of 5 6 Nursing, under § 12–509 of the Health Occupations Article, as enacted by Chapters 757 and 7 758 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2021, for the administration of maintenance injectable medications by a pharmacist shall be the same regulations for the administration 8 of injectable medications for treatment of sexually transmitted infections by a pharmacist 9 adopted in accordance with \S 12–509 of the Health Occupations Article, as enacted by this 10 11 Act.
