#### **SENATE BILL 26**

1 VIOLATION OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE FOR WHICH THE DEFENDANT IS NOT

2 **REQUIRED TO APPEAR** shall be expunged 3 years after a disposition of the charge if no 3 charge in the case resulted in a disposition other than:

- 4 (1) acquittal;
- 5 (2) dismissal;
- 6 (3) not guilty; or

7 (4) nolle prosequi, except nolle prosequi with a requirement of drug or 8 alcohol treatment.

9 (b) For a case described in subsection (a) of this section, the court shall send notice 10 of the disposition of each charge in the case and the date on which expungement is required 11 to:

12 (1) the Central Repository;

13 (2) each booking facility, law enforcement unit, and other unit of the State 14 and political subdivision of the State that the court believes may have a record subject to 15 expungement under this section; and

16 (3) the person entitled to expungement.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 October 1, 2022.
