
## 2 Home- and Community-Based Services Waiver - Participation and Applications

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the required contents of the home- and community-based
- 4 services waiver submitted by the Maryland Department of Health to the Centers for
- 5 Medicare and Medicaid Services; requiring the Department to send an application to
- 6 a certain number of individuals each month, if the Department maintains a waiting
- 7 list or registry for the waiver; and generally relating to the home- and
- 8 community-based services waiver.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

4	(II) A WAIVER APPLICATION SENT UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I)
5	OF THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL STATE CLEARLY AND CONSPICUOUSLY THAT:

- 6 1. The applicant must submit the application WITHIN 6 WEEKS AFTER RECEIVING THE APPLICATION; AND
- 8 2. THE APPLICANT IS REQUIRED TO MEET ALL OF THE 9 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE WAIVER WITHIN 6 MONTHS 10 AFTER SUBMITTING THE APPLICATION.
- 11 **(2)** If a person determined to be eligible to receive waiver services under this section desires to receive waiver services and an appropriate placement is available, the Department shall authorize the placement.
- 14 (f) The Department, in consultation with representatives of the affected industry 15 and advocates for waiver candidates, and with the approval of the Department of Aging, 16 shall adopt regulations to implement this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2022.
