BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Criminal Law Section 10-623 Annotated Code of Maryland (2021 Replacement Volume and 2021 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Criminal Law 10-623.(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. "Collar" means a device constructed of nylon, leather, or similar material specifically designed to be used around the neck of a dog.
