2 Higher Education - Senatorial Scholarships - Program Accreditation

- FOR the purpose of authorizing each Senator to award not more than a certain percentage of funds available under the Senatorial Scholarship Program to applicants planning to attend certain accredited institutions outside the State, provided that the applicant will be studying in an academic area that is not offered in a program that is accredited by a national accrediting association approved by the United States Department of Education in any institution in the State; and generally relating to the Senatorial Scholarship Program.

 - (i) Tuition and mandatory fees; and

- 21(3)Is an individual who is on active duty with the United States military 22 who is domiciled in this State.
 - SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
