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Certified Nursing Assistants – Licensing Requirements

- FOR the purpose of requiring a certified nursing assistant to meet certain federal requirements and pass a competency exam; requiring the Maryland Department of Health to establish a program to assist certified nursing assistants in meeting licensing requirements established by this Act; and generally relating to the licensing of certified nursing assistants.

3 (f) The provisions of this section may not be interpreted to impose additional 4 requirements for [geriatric] CERTIFIED nursing assistants beyond those required under 5 federal law.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1, 2022, 7 the State Board of Nursing shall:

8 (1) adopt regulations for the licensing of certified nursing assistants that 9 are consistent with the requirements of 42 C.F.R. §§ 483.151 through 483.156; and

10 (2) develop procedures to assist individuals licensed as certified nursing 11 assistants prior to October 1, 2022, in achieving compliance with the licensing 12 requirements established by this Act.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 1 of this Act shall take
 effect October 1, 2022.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in Section
 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect June 1, 2022.
