- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission to 5 require certain entrance-level and in-service police training conducted by the State 6 and each county and municipal police training school to include certain training 7 related to the criminal laws concerning stalking as they pertain to electronic 8 surveillance or tracking; and generally relating to police training requirements.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 18 The Commission has the following powers and duties: (a)
- 19 (6)to require, for entrance-level police training and at least every 3 years 20 for in-service level police training conducted by the State and each county and municipal
- 21police training school, that the curriculum and minimum courses of study include special
- 22 training, attention to, and study of the application and enforcement of:
 - (i) the criminal laws concerning rape and sexual offenses, including



- 1 the sexual abuse and exploitation of children and related evidentiary procedures;
- 2 (ii) the criminal laws concerning human trafficking, including
- 3 services and support available to victims and the rights and appropriate treatment of
- 4 victims;
- 5 (iii) the criminal laws concerning hate crimes, including the
- 6 recognition of, response to, and reporting of incidents required to be reported under §
- 7 2–307 of this article;
- 8 (IV) THE CRIMINAL LAWS CONCERNING STALKING AS THEY
- 9 PERTAIN TO ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE OR TRACKING, INCLUDING SERVICES
- 10 AVAILABLE TO VICTIMS, RELATED PREVENTION METHODS FOR VICTIMS, AND HOW
- 11 TO DOCUMENT DIGITAL EVIDENCE;
- 12 [(iv)] (V) the contact with and treatment of victims of crimes and
- 13 delinquent acts;
- 14 [(v)] (VI) the notices, services, support, and rights available to
- 15 victims and victims' representatives under State law; and
- [(vi)] (VII) the notification of victims of identity fraud and related
- 17 crimes of their rights under federal law;
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 19 October 1, 2022.
