10	(2) AT THE END OF A TERM, THE CHAIR:
11	(I) IS ELIGIBLE FOR REDESIGNATION; AND
12 13	(II) CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS DESIGNATED.
14 15	(3) A CHAIR WHO IS DESIGNATED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES ONLY FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS DESIGNATED.
