- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 13 Article Criminal Law
- 14 3–203.
- 15 (a) A person may not commit an assault.
- 16 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a person who violates
- 17 subsection (a) of this section is guilty of the misdemeanor of assault in the second degree
- 18 and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 10 years or a fine not exceeding
- 19 \$2,500 or both.
- 20 (c) (1) In this subsection, "physical injury" means any impairment of physical
- 21 condition, excluding minor injuries.

- 1 (2) A person may not intentionally cause physical injury to another if the 2 person knows or has reason to know that the other is:
- 3 (i) a law enforcement officer engaged in the performance of the 4 officer's official duties;
- 5 (ii) a parole or probation agent engaged in the performance of the 6 agent's official duties; [or]
- 7 (iii) a firefighter, an emergency medical technician, a rescue squad 8 member, or any other first responder engaged in providing emergency medical care or 9 rescue services; **OR**
- 10 (IV) A BUS OPERATOR, A TRAIN OPERATOR, A LIGHT RAIL
 11 OPERATOR, A PARATRANSIT OPERATOR, A STATION ATTENDANT, OR ANY OTHER
 12 INDIVIDUAL ENGAGED IN PROVIDING PUBLIC TRANSIT SERVICES FOR ANY PUBLIC
 13 ENTITY OR ANY PRIVATE ENTITY CONTRACTED WITH A PUBLIC ENTITY TO PROVIDE
 14 PUBLIC TRANSIT SERVICES.
- 15 (3) A person who violates paragraph (2) of this subsection is guilty of the felony of assault in the second degree and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 10 years or a fine not exceeding \$5,000 or both.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2022.
