BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments. Article - Business Occupations and Professions Section 16-802 Annotated Code of Maryland (2018 Replacement Volume and 2021 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article – Business Occupations and Professions** 16 - 802.

1	Subject to the evaluation and reestablishment provisions of the Maryland Program
2	Evaluation Act, this title and all regulations adopted under this title shall terminate and

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- 5 (a) In this section, "Department" means the Maryland Department of Labor.
- 6 (b) The Department, subject to subsection (c) of this section, shall hire a
 7 consultant to conduct an independent evaluation of the State Commission of Real Estate
 8 Appraisers, Appraisal Management Companies, and Home Inspectors, to determine if the
 9 Commission is adhering to the most recent Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal
 10 Standards' diversity, equity, and inclusion guidelines in its regulation of real estate
 11 appraisers and appraisal management companies in the State.
- 12 (c) (1) The independent evaluation of the Commission required under 13 subsection (b) of this section shall be conducted under the supervision of the Office of 14 Program Evaluation and Government Accountability in the Department of Legislative 15 Services who, in consultation with the Department, may:
- 16 <u>(i)</u> <u>write the proposal for the hiring of the consultant;</u>
- 17 <u>(ii)</u> select the consultant; and
- 18 <u>(iii)</u> <u>distribute the evaluation to the committees of jurisdiction, in</u> 19 <u>accordance with the Maryland Program Evaluation Act.</u>
- 20 <u>(2) (i) The Department shall pay the costs of the independent</u> 21 <u>evaluation required under this section.</u>
- 22 (ii) The Department may use funds from the State Commission of 23 Real Estate Appraisers, Appraisal Management Companies, and Home Inspectors Fund to 24 cover the cost of the independent evaluation.
- 25 (d) The independent evaluation required under this section shall be:
- 26 (1) completed for consideration by the committees of jurisdiction during the 27 2023 legislative session; and
- 28 <u>(2)</u> <u>submitted to the Senate Finance Committee and the House Economic</u> 29 <u>Matters Committee by the Office of Program Evaluation and Government Accountability</u> 30 <u>in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, on or before January 1, 2023.</u>
- SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October June 1, 2022.
