SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

15 (b) (1) Each register is entitled to receive an annual salary of not more than 16 [\$124,500] **\$146,500**, to be determined in each instance by the Board of Public Works.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III, § 35
of the Maryland Constitution, this Act may not be construed to extend or apply to the salary
or compensation of a register of wills while serving in a term of office beginning before the

1 effective date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act concerning the salary or 2 compensation of a register of wills shall take effect at the beginning of the next following 3 term of office. This limitation does not apply to an individual appointed or elected after the 4 effective date of this Act to fill out an unexpired term.

5 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2022.
