AN ACT concerning

## Correctional Services - Division of Parole and Probation - Definition of Absconding

FOR the purpose of altering a certain definition of "absconding", as it relates to parole and probation, to include leaving an inpatient residential treatment facility that an individual was placed in under court order without the permission of a certain administrator; and generally relating to the Division of Parole and Probation.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Correctional Services

6-101.
(a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
(b) (1) "Absconding" means willfully evading supervision.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.
[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.
(2) "ABSCONDING" INCLUDES LEAVING AN INPATIENT RESIDENTIAL 2 TREATMENT FACILITY THAT AN INDIVIDUAL WAS PLACED IN UNDER A COURT ORDER 3 FOR DRUG OR ALCOHOL TREATMENT WITHOUT THE PERMISSION OF THE 4 ADMINISTRATOR, AS DEFINED IN § 8-101 OF THE HEALTH - GENERAL Article.
(3) "Absconding" does not include missing a single appointment with a supervising authority.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2022.
