CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Dental Hygienists – Consultation Requirements – Health Care Practitioners**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the types of health care practitioners with whom a dental
4 hygienist must consult before providing certain treatment to a dental patient to
5 include a patient's registered nurse practitioner, certified nurse midwife, or licensed
6 certified midwife; requiring that certain consultations by a dental hygienist be made
7 if there is a change in the patient's medical condition; and generally relating to
8 dental hygienists and the provision of dental services.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Health Occupations**

17 4–308.

18 (k) (4) A facility in which a dental hygienist is authorized to practice under the
19 general supervision of a licensed dentist in accordance with this subsection shall ensure
20 that:

(vi) A dental hygienist consults with the supervising dentist, OR the patient's dentist, ~~REGISTERED NURSE PRACTITIONER, CERTIFIED NURSE MIDWIFE, OR LICENSED CERTIFIED MIDWIFE, or~~ AND THE treating physician, REGISTERED NURSE PRACTITIONER, CERTIFIED NURSE MIDWIFE, OR LICENSED CERTIFIED MIDWIFE before proceeding with treatment if there is a change in the patient's medical history CONDITION;

7 (m) (1) (i) In this subsection the following words have the meanings
8 indicated.

(ii) "Assisted living program" has the meaning stated in § 19-1801 of the Health – General Article.

1. A nursing home;
 2. An assisted living program;
 3. [Medical] CLINICAL offices; or
 4. A group home or adult day care center.

23 [(iv)] (v) "General supervision" means supervision of a dental
24 hygienist by a dentist, where the dentist may or may not be present when the dental
25 hygienist performs the dental hygiene procedures.

26 [(v)] (VI) "Group home or adult day care center" means a group
27 home or adult day care center where the patient's medical records are made available to
28 the dentist and the dental hygienist and that obtains the consent of the patient or the
29 patient's guardian for dental hygiene services to be provided under this subsection.

30 [(vi) "Medical office" means an office of a licensed physician who
31 provides prenatal or primary medical care and in which the physician, supervising dentist,
32 and dental hygienist communicate in providing dental hygiene services to a patient.]

(vii) "Nursing home" has the meaning stated in § 19-1401 of the Health – General Article.

(i) Ensure that, while the dental hygienist is performing the service, the supervising dentist is available for consultation with the dental hygienist:

1. In person;
 2. By telephone; or
 3. Electronically;

(ii) Consult with the supervising dentist ~~or a~~ **AND THE** treating physician ~~OR THE PATIENT'S~~, REGISTERED NURSE PRACTITIONER, CERTIFIED NURSE MIDWIFE, OR LICENSED CERTIFIED MIDWIFE before proceeding with ~~initial~~ treatment if there is a change in or concerns about a patient's medical ~~history~~ CONDITION;

(iii) Assess the appropriate recall interval based on the needs of the patient, or as otherwise recommended by the supervising dentist;

- 17 (iv) Limit dental hygiene tasks and procedures provided during the
18 initial appointment to:

1. Toothbrush prophylaxis;
 2. Application of fluoride;
 3. Dental hygiene instruction;
 4. Full mouth debridement;

23 5. Assessing the patient's apparent need for further
24 evaluation by a dentist in order to diagnose the presence of dental disease; and

25 6. Other duties as may be delegated, verbally or in writing,
26 by the supervising dentist; and

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
31 October 1, 2022.
