- FOR the purpose of <u>prohibiting a person from conducting visual surveillance with prurient intent of an individual located in a residence or place of private use or accommodation without the consent of the individual; altering the penalties for the crime of visual surveillance with prurient intent <u>by use of a camera</u> if the victim was a minor at the time of the offense and the offender is at least a certain number of years older than the victim; and generally relating to the crime of visual surveillance with prurient intent.</u>
