CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

Public Safety – Fire, Rescue, or Emergency Medical Services Entities – Peer Support Programs

- FOR the purpose of establishing certain confidentiality requirements for peer support 4 counseling programs for fire, rescue, or emergency medical services entities; 5 6 requiring the Behavioral Health Administration, in consultation with the Maryland 7 Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems, to issue a report on certain best practices relating to peer support counseling for fire, rescue, or emergency medical 8 9 services entities and to make certain information regarding peer support counseling 10 publicly available on the Administration's website; and generally relating to peer 11 support programs for fire, rescue, or emergency medical services entities.

- 28 2. AN EXPLICIT THREAT OF IMMINENT AND SERIOUS
- 29 BODILY HARM OR DEATH TO A CLEARLY IDENTIFIED OR IDENTIFIABLE INDIVIDUAL;
- 3. INFORMATION RELATING TO THE ABUSE OR NEGLECT
- 31 OF A CHILD OR VULNERABLE ADULT, OR ABUSE OR NEGLECT THAT IS OTHERWISE
- 32 REQUIRED TO BE REPORTED BY LAW; OR
 - 4. THE ADMISSION OF CRIMINAL CONDUCT;

- 1 (II) THE DISCLOSURE IS AUTHORIZED BY EACH PEER SUPPORT
- 2 PARTICIPANT WHO WAS A PARTY TO THE COMMUNICATION; OR
- 3 (III) A COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION ISSUES AN ORDER 4 OR SUBPOENA REQUIRING THE DISCLOSURE OF THE COMMUNICATION.
- 5 (3) BEFORE THE INITIAL PEER SUPPORT COUNSELING SESSION WITH
- 6 A PEER SUPPORT PARTICIPANT, A PEER SUPPORT SPECIALIST SHALL INFORM THE
- 7 PEER SUPPORT PARTICIPANT IN WRITING OF THE CONFIDENTIALITY PROVISIONS IN
- 8 THIS SUBSECTION.
- 9 (C) (1) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2024, THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH
- 10 ADMINISTRATION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE MARYLAND INSTITUTE FOR
- 11 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SYSTEMS, SHALL DEVELOP A REPORT ON BEST
